## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A House Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Cloning of Humans
- 3 FOR the purpose of expressing the intent of the General Assembly of Maryland to ban
- 4 State funding of cloning and cloning research that would replicate a human being.
- 5 WHEREAS, Scottish scientist Ian Wilmut has generated both awe and angst with 6 his successful cloning of a mammal; and
- WHEREAS, The principles of industrial production and design, such as quality
- 8 control, predictability, profitability, and efficiency, should never be allowed to apply to
- 9 the production of humans; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Social, ethical, and moral values should not be sacrificed in favor of
- 11 the dubious potential benefits of scientific experimentation in human cloning; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Cloning would tend to devalue human life or dehumanize mankind;
- 13 and
- WHEREAS, In a recently published poll, 90% of respondents favored prohibiting
- 15 cloning by law; now, therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That it is the
- 17 intent of the General Assembly of Maryland to ban State funding of cloning and cloning
- 18 research that would replicate a human being; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 20 Legislative Reference to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland; the
- 21 Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and the
- 22 Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
