8 9	(D) THE GOVERNOR SHALL SELECT A CHAIRMAN FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE.
10 11	(E) (1) THE TASK FORCE SHALL HAVE ITS FIRST MEETING NO LATER THAN JUNE 30, 1997 AT THE CALL OF THE CHAIRMAN.
12	(2) THE TASK FORCE SHALL MEET AT LEAST MONTHLY.
	(3) THE TASK FORCE MAY ESTABLISH SUBCOMMITTEES FROM THE MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE TO ACCOMPLISH THE DUTIES IMPOSED BY THIS SECTION.
16	(4) A MEMBER OF THE TASK FORCE:
17	(I) MAY NOT RECEIVE COMPENSATION; BUT

17 18	(G) THE OFFICE OF PLANNING, <u>WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE</u> , SHALL PROVIDE PRIMARY STAFF SUPPORT TO THE TASK FORCE.
21 22	(H) ON OR BEFORE DECEMBER 1, 1997 JULY 1, 1998, THE TASK FORCE SHALL REPORT ITS RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE GOVERNOR, AND, SUBJECT TO § 2-1312 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE SENATE ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE, AND THE HOUSE ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS COMMITTEE.
	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1997. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and 1 month and, at the end of June 30, 1998, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall
