- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the making of a tattoo on a minor under certain
- 4 circumstances; providing a certain defense; specifying a penalty; defining a certain

- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article 27 Crimes and Punishments
- 14 MINORS TATTOOS
- 15 405B.
- 16 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "TATTOO" MEANS A DESIGN OR MARK MADE ON THE 17 SKIN BY:
- 18 (1) PRICKING THE SKIN AND INGRAINING IN IT AN INDELIBLE PIGMENT;
- 19 OR
- 20 (2) RAISING SCARS ON THE SKIN.
- 21 (B) A PERSON MAY NOT MAKE A TATTOO ON A MINOR UNLESS A PARENT OR
- 22 GUARDIAN OF THE MINOR IS PRESENT DURING AND CONSENTS TO THE TATTOO.
- 23 (C) (1) IN THE PROSECUTION FOR A VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION, IT SHALL
- 24 BE A DEFENSE THAT THE DEFENDANT USED DUE CAUTION TO DETERMINE THAT
- 25 THE TATTOO RECIPIENT WAS AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD AT THE TIME OF THE TATTOO.
- 26 (2) THERE IS A PRESUMPTION OF DUE CAUTION IF:

1 (I) THE DEFENDANT EXAMINED THE TATTOO RECIPIES

- 2 DRIVER'S LICENSE OR OTHER VALID IDENTIFICATION ISSUED BY AN EMPLOYER, A
- 3 GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY, OR AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION; AND
- 4 (II) THE IDENTIFICATION POSITIVELY IDENTIFIED THE TATTOO
- 5 RECIPIENT AS AT LEAST 18 YEARS OLD.
- 6 (D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR
- 7 AND SHALL BE SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$300.
- 8 (E) FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, EACH SEPARATE AND DISTINCT
- 9 INCIDENT AT A DIFFERENT TIME AND OCCASION IS A SEPARATE VIOLATION.
- 10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 11 October 1, 1997.
