11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 Article - Education

14 7-208.

FOR PURPOSES OF AWARDING ACADEMIC CREDIT AND SATISFYING
GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS, AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE SHALL BE DEEMED A

17 COURSE IN FOREIGN LANGUAGE.

18 11-208.

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A PUBLIC INSTITUTION
OF HIGHER EDUCATION SHALL DEEM AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE A COURSE IN
FOREIGN LANGUAGE FOR PURPOSES OF AWARDING ACADEMIC CREDIT AND
SATISFYING GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 24 July 1, 1997.
