2 Cosmetology - Waiver of Examination Requirement

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering provisions relating to the waiver of certain cosmetology
- 4 examination requirements; and requiring an individual who is licensed in another
- 5 state to pass an examination in the other state at least equivalent to the examination
- 6 in this State before the examination requirement may be waived.

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article - Business Occupations and Professions

15 5-308.

- 16 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board [shall] MAY waive any
- 17 examination requirement of this subtitle for an individual who is licensed to practice as a
- 18 cosmetologist or a limited practice cosmetologist in another state.
- 19 (b) The Board may grant a waiver under this section only if the applicant:
- 20 (1) pays to the Board an application fee established by the Board in
- 21 accordance with § 5-205 of this title; and
- 22 (2) provides adequate evidence that the applicant:
- 23 (i) meets the qualifications otherwise required by this subtitle; and
- 24 (ii) became licensed in the other state after [meeting] PASSING, in
- 25 that or any other state, [requirements] AN EXAMINATION that [are] IS at least
- 26 equivalent to the [licensing requirements of this State] EXAMINATION FOR WHICH THE
- 27 APPLICANT IS SEEKING A WAIVER.
