## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

FOR the purpose of prohibiting certain responsible persons from transporting more than a certain number of pupils on a school bus except under certain circumstances; prohibiting certain responsible persons from allowing pupils riding on a school bus to stand while the bus is in motion except under certain circumstances; requiring the driver of a school bus to drive at a reduced rate of speed when pupils are standing; requiring the Motor Vehicle Administration and the State Department of Education to adopt certain regulations on or before a certain date; requiring the State Department of Education to report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date; and generally relating to a prohibition against pupils standing on a school bus that is in motion.

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
9 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Transportation

(a) The driver of a school bus:
(1) Is responsible for its operation; and
(2) May not drive it into any roadway without first stopping and determining that there is no danger from any other vehicle.
(b) The person responsible for any pupils on a school bus is:
(1) The teacher on the bus; or
(2) If a teacher is not present, the driver.
(I) TRANSPORT MORE PUPILS THAN THE QUANTITY AUTHORIZED

BY THE SEATING CAPACITY OF THE SCHOOL BUS AS DETERMINED BY THE
ADMINISTRATION BY REGULATION UNDER § 25-110(A)(2)(III) OF THIS ARTICLE; AND
(II) ALLOW A PUPIL TO STAND WHILE THE SCHOOL BUS IS IN
(2) (I) [A] IN AN EMERGENCY SITUATION, A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may [not permit] ALLOW A PUPIL TO STAND WHILE THE SCHOOL BUS IS IN MOTION, PROVIDED THAT EVERY AVAILABLE SEAT ON THE SCHOOL BUS IS OCCUPIED BY A PUPIL.
(II) [the] THE number of standing pupils [to] MAY NOT exceed one pupil for each part of the aisle that is bounded on both sides by forward facing seats.
(3) WHEN A PUPIL IS STANDING ON A SCHOOL BUS THAT IS IN MOTION, THE DRIVER SHALL PROCEED AT A REDUCED RATE OF SPEED TO MAXIMIZE THE SAFETY OF THE PUPIL, TAKING INTO ACCOUNT EXISTING TRAFFIC CONDITIONS.
(d) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to stand if the school bus is equipped only with lengthwise or a combination of lengthwise and forward facing seats.
(e) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to stand in front of the stanchion and guardrail.
(f) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not permit any pupil to operate the front door opening mechanism, except in an emergency.
(g) A person responsible for pupils on a school bus may not require any pupil to sit on the floor.
(h) Except for the driver and any fuel station attendant, a person may not occupy a school bus while it is being supplied with fuel.
(i) Either the driver or an adult aide assigned to each school vehicle that is used to transport handicapped children shall be certified as having successfully completed a first aid-safety course approved by the Department of Education.

(a) (1) With the advice of the State Department of Education, the [Motor Vehicle] Administration shall adopt and enforce rules and regulations not inconsistent with the Maryland Vehicle Law to govern the safe operation of all school vehicles.
(2) (I) THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT DEFINE AN EMERGENCY SITUATION FOR THE PURPOSES OF § 21-1118(C) OF THIS ARTICLE WHICH SHALL:
(II) IF ONE EMERGENCY SITUATION DEFINED BY THE 9 ADMINISTRATION IS THE OVERCROWDING OF A SCHOOL BUS DUE TO
0 UNCERTAINTY ABOUT THE DEMAND FOR SEATS ON A GIVEN SCHOOL BUS ROUTE
AT THE BEGINNING OF A NEW SCHOOL YEAR, THE REGULATIONS SHALL ALLOW
PUPILS TO STAND ON A SCHOOL BUS IN RESPONSE TO SUCH AN EMERGENCY
3 SITUATION ONLY DURING THE FIRST 15-SCHOOL DAYS OF A NEW SCHOOL YEAR.

DETERMINED BY THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE ADMINISTRATION IS DIFFERENT FROM THE MANUFACTURER'S RATED SEATING CAPACITY FOR THE SCHOOL BUS, THE SEATING CAPACITY AS DETERMINED BY THE ADMINISTRATION SHALL BE USED FOR PURPOSES OF § 21-1118(C)(1)(I) OF THIS ARTICLE.
[(2)] (3) The following shall be subject to the rules and regulations adopted 24 under this section:
(i) Every school or school district and its officers and employees;
(iii) Every person that owns or operates a school vehicle.

31 with these rules and regulations in any contract executed by him on behalf of a school or 2 school district is guilty of misconduct and subject to removal from office or employment.

1 reasons for standing pupils. The report also shall include information on the success of 2 each jurisdiction in complying with the time limits established by the Motor Vehicle
3 Administration under § 25-110(a)(2)(i)2 of the Transportation Article for remedying an 4 emergency situation requiring pupils to stand on buses that are in motion.

5 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Motor Vehicle
6 Administration shall adopt new regulations under § 25-110(a)(2) of the Transportation
7 Article in time for implementation at the beginning of the 1997-1998 school year. The
8 State Department of Education shall adopt as necessary new regulations consistent with 9 this Act in time for implementation at the beginning of the 1997-1998 school year.

SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 11 July 1, 1997.
