1 AN ACT concerning

2 Good Samaritan Immunity - Emergency Medical Technician-Paramedics

3 FOR the purpose of clarifying that an individual who is certified by the State as an

- 4 emergency medical technician-paramedic is entitled to qualified immunity from
- 5 civil liability for providing emergency <u>assistance or</u> medical care <u>under certain</u>
- 6 <u>circumstances</u>; repealing a certain provision requiring paramedics to undergo
- 7 <u>making passage of a certain Act contingent on the passage of legislation creating a</u>
- 8 State licensing procedure <u>for paramedics</u>; changing a reference from "emergency
- 9 medical technician" to "emergency medical technician paramedic"; providing for
- 10 the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to qualified immunity from civil
- 11 liability for providing emergency medical care and emergency medical
- 12 technician-paramedics.

21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

| 19 20 | (i) Has completed an American Red Cross course in advanced first aid and has a current card showing that status; |
| 21 22 | (ii) Has completed an equivalent of an American Red Cross course in advanced first aid, as determined by the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; or |
| 23 24 | (iii) Is certified by this State as an [emergency medical technician] EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN PARAMEDIC or cardiac rescue technician; |
| 25 26 | (3) A volunteer fire department, ambulance and rescue squad whose members have immunity; |
| 27 28 | (4) A corporation when its fire department personnel are immune under paragraph (2) of this subsection. |
| | (c) An individual who is not covered otherwise by this section is not civilly liable for any act or omission in providing assistance or medical aid to a victim at the scene of an emergency, if: |
| 32 | (1) The assistance or aid is provided in a reasonably prudent manner; |
| 33 | (2) The assistance or aid is provided without fee or other compensation; and |
| 34 35 | (3) The individual relinquishes care of the victim when someone who is licensed or certified by this State to provide medical care or services becomes available to |

2 [SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the passage of this Act is
3 contingent upon the passage of an Act which creates a State licensing procedure for
4 paramedics. If such an Act is not enacted, the provisions of this Act are null and void
5 without the need of further action by the General Assembly.]

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is intended to

7 clarify that an individual who is certified by the State Board of Physician Quality

8 Assurance as an emergency medical technician-paramedic, also known as an "EMT-P" or

9 "paramedic", is entitled under § 5-309(b)(2)(iii) of the Courts Article to qualified

10 immunity from civil liability for providing emergency assistance or medical care without

11 undergoing a State licensing procedure for paramedics.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October June 1, 1997.

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
