A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages

3 (Board of License Commissioners)

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a commissioner or employee of the Board of License

- 5 Commissioners for Baltimore City from soliciting or receiving, directly or on behalf
- 6 of another person, a political contribution from certain persons; prohibiting a
- 7 licensee or a person who is engaged in the manufacture or sale of alcoholic
- 8 beverages from making a political contribution to certain persons; authorizing the
- 9 Chairman of the Board to authorize the Executive Secretary of the Board to
- 10 supervise certain activities of certain employees of the Board; requiring employees
- 11 of the Board to be in the classified civil service of the City of Baltimore; specifying
- 12 that the Board may appoint and remove employees only in accordance with the
- 13 provisions of law governing classified civil service employees of the City of
- 14 Baltimore; providing for the appointment of certain employees of the Board to the
- 15 classified civil service of the City of Baltimore; making certain technical changes;
- 16 making certain stylistic changes; and generally relating to the Board of License
- 17 Commissioners in Baltimore City.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

10 (b) The respective board shall be authorized to employ a secretary and such 11 inspectors, clerical and other assistance as may be necessary, and to fix the compensation 12 of such employees, except as otherwise provided by this article.

(e) In Baltimore City (1) no commissioner, or employee of the Board shall have any interest, direct or indirect, either proprietary or by means of any loan, mortgage or loan, mortgage or loan, or in any other manner, in or on any premises where alcoholic beverages are manufactured or sold; nor shall he have any interest, direct or indirect, in any business wholly or partially devoted to the manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages, or own any stock in any corporation which has any interest, proprietary or otherwise, direct or indirect, in any premises where alcoholic beverages are manufactured or sold or in any business wholly or partially devoted to the manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages, or load any other public office or employment, federal, State or local.

(2) Every employee of said Board shall devote his whole time and attention
to the business of the Board during the hours designated by the Board for the
performance of his or her official duties, and shall not engage in any occupation, business
or profession in any way connected or associated, directly or indirectly, with the
manufacture or sale of alcoholic beverages and shall transact no business of any kind
whatsoever beyond his or her official duties with any licensee, or in connection with the
operation of any establishment licensed for the manufacture or sale of alcoholic
beverages. [Not more than eighteen persons shall be employed at any one time by the
Board on a part-time basis.] Any employee of said Board who violates any of the
provisions of this section shall be removed.

(3) [No commissioner or employee of the Board shall solicit or receive
directly or indirectly any commission, remuneration or gift whatsoever from any person,
or corporation engaged in the manufacture or sale of beer or other alcoholic beverages,
nor from any agent or employee of such person or corporation, or from any licensee,
licensed under the provisions of this article. No person or corporation engaged in the
manufacture or sale of beer or other alcoholic beverages, nor any agent or employee of
such person or corporation, and no licensee licensed under the provisions of this article,
shall, either directly or indirectly, offer to pay any commission, profit or remuneration or
make any gift to any commissioner or employee of the Board or to anyone on behalf of
such commissioner or employee of said Board.]

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	(I) A COMMISSIONER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD MAY NOT SOLICIT OR RECEIVE, DIRECTLY OR ON BEHALF OF ANOTHER PERSON, A COMMISSION, POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION, REMUNERATION, OR GIFT FROM:

	2. MAKE A POLITICAL CONTRIBUTION OR GIFT TO A COMMISSIONER, EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD, OR PERSON ON BEHALF OF A COMMISSIONER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE BOARD.		
19 20 21 22	 (4) [The chairman of said Board shall be the administrative officer thereof and charged with the duty of enforcing the provisions of this article. It shall be his duty personally to supervise the activities and investigations of the several inspectors and other employees of the Board. He shall examine the location and general character of the licensees in said City and make recommendations to the Board concerning zoning of licensees, methods of enforcement, and promulgation of rules and regulations to carry out the purposes of this article.] 		
24 25	(I) THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD IS THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER OF THE BOARD AND SHALL ENFORCE THE PROVISIONS OF THIS ARTICLE.

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(5) Rules and regulations adopted by the Board in said City shall be
 published and distributed to such licensees as may be affected thereby. The Board in said
 City shall have the power to require any licensee to display prominently in his place of
 business any rule or regulation of said Board, or any excerpt or statement from this
 article.

6 (6) IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER PROVISION IN THIS SUBSECTION,
7 COMMISSIONERS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD SHALL COMPLY WITH THE
8 MARYLAND PUBLIC ETHICS LAW.

9 (7) ON OR BEFORE JANUARY 30 OF EACH YEAR, THE BOARD SHALL
10 SUBMIT TO THE GOVERNOR A WRITTEN REPORT ON ALL MATTERS CONCERNING
11 THE OPERATION OF THE BOARD FOR THE PRECEDING CALENDAR YEAR.

12 [(e-1) In Baltimore City, the Board of License Commissioners shall:

13 (1) Employ 18 permanent part-time inspectors; and

14 (2) Set the annual salary for permanent part-time inspectors at not less than15 \$1,200.]

16 (E-1) (1) THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO BALTIMORE CITY AND DOES
17 NOT ALTER THE METHOD BY WHICH THE SALARIES OF THE EMPLOYEES OF THE
18 BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS IN BALTIMORE CITY ARE CURRENTLY
19 FUNDED.

20 (2) (I) THE EMPLOYEES OF THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS 21 SHALL BE IN THE CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE OF THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.

(II) THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY APPOINT AND
 REMOVE EMPLOYEES ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF LAW THAT
 GOVERN CLASSIFIED CIVIL SERVICE EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF BALTIMORE.

(3) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, THE BOARD
OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS MAY NOT EMPLOY MORE THAN 18 PERMANENT
PART-TIME INSPECTORS.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That each individual who is an employee of the Board of License Commissioners for Baltimore City on the effective date of this Act shall be appointed to the classified service of the City of Baltimore as of the effective date of this Act without further examination or qualification. The employee shall be placed in a classification that is comparable in duties and responsibilities to the employee's former position. The employee may not suffer a diminution of salary or wages, accrued leave, whether earned or granted, or seniority rights.

35 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 October 1, 1997.

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
