19 (i) in the license term that begins in 1992, at least 12 clock hours of

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	(ii) in and after the license term that begins in 1996, at least 15 clock hours of continuing education instruction, as provided in this section, during the preceding 2-year term.

	(e) On completion of a continuing education course by a licensee, the entity that conducted the course or the instructor shall issue to the licensee a certificate of completion that states the number of clock hours of that course.

6	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to:
7 8	(1) currently licensed real estate brokers, associate real estate brokers, and real estate salespersons; and
9	(2) the license term beginning in 1998.
