1 AN ACT concerning

2 Retirement and Pensions - Workers' Compensation Offset - Payments to Third Parties

3 FOR the purpose of exempting from a certain offset from certain disability retirement

- 4 benefits of retirees of the State retirement and pension systems certain workers'
- 5 compensation benefits that are reimbursement for legal fees, medical expenses, or
- 6 other payments to third parties and not to the retiree.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

15 29-118.

16 (a) This section applies to a retiree and any designated beneficiary.

(b) (1) The Board of Trustees shall reduce a disability retirement benefit by any
related workers' compensation benefits paid or payable after the effective date of
retirement if the workers' compensation benefits:

20 (i) are paid or payable while a pension is paid or payable; and

1 (ii) are for an accidental personal injury or occupational disease 2 arising out of and in the course of the retiree's employment by a participating employer.

- 3 (2) A retirement allowance may not be reduced:
- 4 (I) to be less than the sum of the retiree's annuity and the amount 5 authorized to be deducted for health insurance premiums; OR

6 (II) FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION BENEFITS THAT ARE
7 REIMBURSEMENTS FOR LEGAL FEES, MEDICAL EXPENSES, OR OTHER PAYMENTS
8 MADE TO THIRD PARTIES AND NOT TO THE RETIREE.

9 (c) The retirement allowance to be reduced under this section is the retirement 10 allowance at retirement without any cost-of-living adjustment and is retroactive.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 1997.
