# 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Health Occupations - Scope of Practice

3	FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person who is licensed, certified, or otherwise
4	authorized to practice a health occupation under certain provisions of law from
5	practicing the health occupation on animals unless authorized by the State Board of
6	Veterinary Medical Examiners; specifying certain exceptions; adding a person
7	practicing acupuncture in accordance with certain restrictions to the list of
8	exclusions from the practice of veterinary medicine; authorizing the Board of
9	Veterinary Medical Examiners to allow the practice of a health occupation on an
10	animal by certain health care practitioners; providing that a veterinary practitioner
11	is immune from civil liability under certain circumstances; and generally relating to
12	the scope of practice for health occupations.
