A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Morticians License

3	FOR the purpose of repealing a provision that specifies certain educational requirements
4	for an applicant for an apprentice license; requiring that, prior to an individual
5	appearing before the State Board of Morticians for approval of an apprentice
6	license, certain educational requirements be completed; altering a provision that
7	restricts the number of years that an applicant for a mortician license may serve a
8	a licensed apprentice; providing a certain ground for the denial, suspension, or
9	revocation of a license or the reprimand of a licensee; authorizing the Board, the
10	Attorney General, or a State's Attorney to bring a certain action to enjoin certain
11	activities; requiring that a certain action be brought in a certain county; requiring
12	sellers of pre-need contracts to annually have the seller's accounts audited by

- 13 certain public accountants; requiring that sellers of pre-need contracts submit to 14 the Board a certain annual qualified audit by a certain date; requiring that, after
- cremation, a licensee ensure that a plastic identification tag be placed in a certain
- 16 container; and generally relating to licensed morticians.

27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

28 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3	(b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of mortuary science and shall issue the mortician license to any person who:
5 6	(2) Has completed not less than 1 year and not more than [4] 2 years of licensed apprenticeship, unless the Board allowed extensions for additional 1-year terms;

8 9	(a) An individual shall obtain an apprentice license from the Board before beginning an apprenticeship in this State.
10 11	(b) An applicant for an apprentice license shall pay to the Board a fee set by the Board.
14 15 16	[(c) The applicant shall have graduated from 4 years of high school or have the equivalent of 12 years formal education certified by a State Department of Education or have attained an associate of arts, bachelor of science, or bachelor of arts degree from a college or university approved by an accrediting agency of the United States Department of Education. Certified evidence of a high school or general education diploma or a college degree shall be presented to the Board and made a part of the applicant's record.
18 19	(d) (1) The applicant shall demonstrate to the Board the intention of fulfilling the educational requirements for mortician licensure.]
22 23 24	(C) (1) PRIOR TO AN INDIVIDUAL APPEARING BEFORE THE BOARD FOR APPROVAL OF AN APPRENTICE LICENSE, THE INDIVIDUAL MUST COMPLETE TWO-THIRDS OF THE ACADEMIC CREDITS FOR A MORTUARY SCIENCE PROGRAM AT A SCHOOL ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE OR APPROVED BY THE BOARD, WITH A 2.0 GRADE POINT AVERAGE OR HIGHER THAT IS VERIFIED WITH A CERTIFIED COPY OF THE COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT.
	(2) The applicant shall appear before the Board with the applicant's sponsor. The sponsor shall hold a current valid mortician license in Maryland and shall be employed by the same funeral home that employs the apprentice.
29	(3) The practical experience of an apprentice shall include:
30	(i) Participation in at least 25 funerals;
31	(ii) Assistance in the embalming of at least 25 dead human bodies; and
	(iii) Completion of 2,000 working hours in a licensed funeral establishment under the direct supervision of a licensed mortician. Supervision may include instruction by other licensed morticians employed or supervised by the sponsor.
35	(4) On termination of the sponsor-apprentice relationship, both the sponsor

	(ii) The name, date of death, and date of service for each decedent for whom a funeral service was conducted under paragraph (3)(i) of this subsection in which the apprentice participated; and
4 5	(iii) The name, date of death, and date of embalming of each decedent for whom the apprentice assisted in accordance with paragraph (3)(ii) of this subsection.
6 7	(5) Prior approval must be granted by the Board before a change of sponsorship occurs.
	[(e)] (D) While the license is effective, an apprentice license authorizes the licensee to assist a licensed mortician in the practice of mortuary science only as part of a training program to become a licensed mortician.

14	(a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 7-319 of this subtitle and except as to a funeral establishment license, the Board may deny a license to any applicant, reprimand any licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke any license if the applicant or licensee:
16	(29) Fails to allow an inspection under § 7-205(8) of this title; [or]
17 18	(30) Fails to comply with inspection requirements in the time specified by the Board[.]; OR
19 20	(31) FAILS TO PROVIDE THE BOARD AN ANNUAL UNQUALIFIED AUDIT IN ACCORDANCE WITH \S 7-405(G)(1) AND (2) OF THIS TITLE.

22 23	(A) AN ACTION MAY BE MAINTAINED IN THE NAME OF THE STATE OR THE BOARD TO ENJOIN:
24	(1) THE UNAUTHORIZED PRACTICE OF MORTUARY SCIENCE; OR
25 26	(2) CONDUCT THAT CONSTITUTES A GROUND FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION UNDER \S 7-315 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
27	(B) AN ACTION UNDER THIS SECTION MAY BE BROUGHT BY:
28	(1) THE BOARD;
29	(2) THE ATTORNEY GENERAL; OR
30	(3) A STATE'S ATTORNEY.
