- 4 FOR the purpose of clarifying that nothing in the Agricultural Land Preservation law
- 5 prohibits the State or a county from condemning land under a county agricultural
- 6 land preservation program easement for public purposes; requiring the State or a
- 7 county when condemning lands under a county agricultural land preservation
- 8 program easement to pay the owner of the land an amount equal to what the owner
- 9 would be entitled to if the land were not under the easement minus a certain
- amount and to pay the county agricultural land preservation program the amount it

2 1 (1985 Replacement Volume and 1996 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 4 **Article - Agriculture** 5 2-502. There is a Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation in the Department. 6 7 The Foundation has the powers and duties provided in this subtitle. 8 2-515. 9 (a) This subtitle does not prohibit [any] AN agency of the State or of a county 10 from acquiring by condemnation land which is under an agricultural preservation 11 easement held by the Foundation OR A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LAND 12 PRESERVATION PROGRAM if such acquisition is for a public purpose. 13 (b) In the event of condemnation of land under an agricultural preservation 14 easement, the condemning authority, whether State or county, shall pay: 15 (1) To the landowner the full amount to which the landowner would be 16 entitled if the land was not under easement, less any amount paid to the landowner by the 17 Foundation OR A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM for the 18 easement: and 19 (2) To the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Fund OR A COUNTY 20 AGRICULTURAL LAND PRESERVATION PROGRAM, an amount equal to any amount 21 paid by the Foundation OR THE COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LAND PRESERVATION 22 PROGRAM for the easement. 23 (c) (1) If a part or all of the property is acquired by the exercise of the power of 24 eminent domain, the fair market value of the property is not affected by its having been 25 qualified for a tax credit under § 9-206 of the Tax - Property Article except that there 26 shall be deducted from fair market value the lesser of: 27 (i) The value of the easement granted; or (ii) The excess of the aggregate amount of the property taxes that 28 29 would have been due on the property if the easement had not been granted above the 30 aggregate amount of property taxes actually paid on the property since the easement was 31 granted. (2) If the Foundation OR A COUNTY AGRICULTURAL LAND 32 33 PRESERVATION PROGRAM purchases the easement for a monetary consideration, other 34 than or in addition to, the tax credit, the condemnation award shall be further reduced by 35 an amount equal to the additional consideration.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
