5	Maryland's Dairy Industry; authorizing a certain milk processor to establish a

8	study to the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene; requiring the Secretary of

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

 $20\,$  MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## Article - Health - General

- 2 21-426.
- 3 (a) In this section, "sell-by period" means the length of time a Grade A milk 4 product may be kept for sale.
- 5 (b) (1) After a public hearing, the Secretary shall adopt rules and regulations
- 6 that establish a method for conspicuously marking, on the Grade A milk product
- 7 container, the last date on which the product may be sold.
- 8 (2) Each Grade A milk product container shall be marked as required by 9 rules and regulations adopted under this subtitle.
- 10 (c) [A] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (D) OF THIS SECTION, A Grade
- 11 A milk product that is cooled to, packaged, and stored at 45 degrees Fahrenheit or less
- 12 before it is purchased by or delivered to the ultimate consumer has a sell-by period of 14
- 13 days.
- 14 (D) (1) A GRADE A MILK PROCESSOR MAY ESTABLISH A SELL-BY PERIOD
- 15 THAT IS LONGER THAN 14 DAYS.
- 16 (2) IF A GRADE A MILK PROCESSOR ESTABLISHES A SELL-BY PERIOD
- 17 THAT IS LONGER THAN 14 DAYS, THE PROCESSOR SHALL SUBMIT TO THE
- 18 SECRETARY AN INDICATOR SHELF LIFE STUDY THAT IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE
- 19 SECRETARY WHICH DEMONSTRATES THAT THE GRADE A MILK PRODUCT HAS A
- 20 SHELF LIFE EQUAL TO THE SELL-BY PERIOD PLUS AN ADDITIONAL 7 DAYS.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Secretary of Health
- 22 and Mental Hygiene in conjunction with the Secretary of Agriculture shall study the
- 23 feasibility of establishing a standardized test for antibiotics in raw milk. The study of a
- 24 standardized testing method shall take into consideration whether the standardized
- 25 testing method would be acceptable for use in conjunction with the testing standards used
- 26 in surrounding states, including New York.
- 27 <u>SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Secretary of Health</u>
- 28 and Mental Hygiene shall report to the General Assembly on or before October 1, 1998,
- 29 in accordance with § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, on the study of the
- 30 <u>feasibility of establishing a standardized test for antibiotics in raw milk.</u>
- 31 SECTION 2. 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 32 October 1, 1997.
