WHEREAS, As the nation and this State seek to establish a world-class education

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3	WHEREAS, The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards assists teachers in their quest for excellence by assessing and certifying teachers throughout the nation who demonstrate the knowledge and skills needed to assist students to meet high standards of student achievement; and
