3 FOR the purpose of requiring a license to provide hair braiding services; defining hair

- 4 braiding services; specifying the qualifications of an applicant for a license to
- 5 provide hair braiding services; specifying the scope of practice of the license;
- 6 clarifying the scope of the practice of cosmetology; providing for a beauty salon

7 permit for a beauty salon that provides only hair braiding services; setting standards

- 8 for apprenticeships in hair braiding; excluding from the scope of licensure certain
- 9 <u>hair braiding services; providing for the effective date of this Act;</u> and generally
- 10 relating to hair braiding and cosmetology in the State.

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
