## A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Health Occupations - Alcohol and Drug Counselors - Certification

- 3 FOR the purpose of altering certain qualifications for certification as a certified associate
- 4 counselor-alcohol and drug; altering certain qualifications for the waiver of certain
- 5 requirements for certification as a certified professional counselor-alcohol and
- 6 drug, certified associate counselor-alcohol and drug, and certified supervised
- 7 counselor-alcohol and drug; correcting certain erroneous titles; and generally
- 8 relating to the qualifications for certification as an alcohol and drug counselor.
