- 4 FOR the purpose of authorizing a physician to prescribe or administer controlled
- 5 dangerous substances to individuals for treatment of intractable pain under certain
- 6 circumstances; prohibiting the Board of Physician Quality Assurance from taking
- 7 certain disciplinary action against a physician who prescribes or administers
- 8 controlled dangerous substances to an individual for the treatment of intractable
- 9 pain; specifying the application of this Act; specifying that this Act does not affect
- the power of the Board to take certain disciplinary actions against a physician under
- 11 certain circumstances; specifying that this Act may not be construed to affect the
- power of a governing body of a hospital from taking certain disciplinary action
- against a physician; defining certain terms; and generally relating to authorizing a
- 14 physician to prescribe or administer controlled dangerous substances to individuals

- 27 (2) "CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE" HAS THE MEANING 28 STATED IN ARTICLE 27, § 277 OF THE CODE.
- 29 (3) "DRUG" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN ARTICLE 27, § 277 OF THE

1	(4) "INTRACTABLE PAIN" MEANS A STATE OF PAIN IN WHICH THE
2	CAUSE OF THE PAIN CANNOT BE REMOVED OR OTHERWISE TREATED AND WHICH,
	IN THE GENERALLY ACCEPTED COURSE OF MEDICAL PRACTICE, NO RELIEF OR
	CURE OF THE CAUSE OF THE PAIN IS POSSIBLE OR NONE HAS BEEN FOUND AFTER
	REASONABLE EFFORTS, INCLUDING EVALUATION BY AN INDIVIDUAL'S ATTENDING
	PHYSICIAN AND ONE OR MORE PHYSICIANS THAT SPECIALIZE IN THE TREATMENT
	OF THE AREA, SYSTEM, OR ORGAN OF THE BODY PERCEIVED AS THE SOURCE OF
	THE PAIN.

9	(B) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, A PHYSICIAN MAY
10	PRESCRIBE OR ADMINISTER A CONTROLLED DANGEROUS SUBSTANCE TO AN
11	INDIVIDUAL IN THE COURSE OF THE PHYSICIAN'S TREATMENT OF THE INDIVIDUAL
	FOR A DIAGNOSED CONDITION CAUSING INTRACTABLE PAIN.
13	(C) THE BOARD MAY NOT SUBJECT A PHYSICIAN TO DISCIPLINARY ACTION

- 2 BODY OF A HOSPITAL FROM TAKING DISCIPLINARY ACTION AGAINST A PHYSICIAN
- 3 AS A RESULT OF THE PROVISIONS OF § 19-319(E) OF THE HEALTH GENERAL
