6 7	(a) The Attorney General is the legal adviser of and shall represent and otherwise perform all of the legal work for:		
8	(1) the Board of Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore City;

	11 (b) (1) The Attorney General may advise or represent a political subdivision of 12 the State or any of its officers, employees, or agents as to a matter that relates to State or 13 federal antitrust law.

	(4) This subsection does not deprive any political subdivision, officer, employee, or agent of any right to retain counsel, at the expense of the subdivision, officer, employee, or agent.
