- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 17
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages
- 20 2-101.
- 21 (s) (1) In this subsection, "permit" means a family beer and wine facility permit.
- 22 (2) A permit authorizes the holder to establish a facility for the production
- 23 of family beer or wine by nonlicensed State consumers who are of legal drinking age.
- (3) The permit holder may provide equipment, raw materials, and
- 25 instructions to the consumer. Except for beer or wine produced for testing equipment or
- 26 recipes, the permit holder may not engage in the actual production or manufacture of
- 27 beer or wine.

1 (4) All family beer and wine produced at a family beer and wine facility shall 2 be removed from the premises by the consumer. It may only be used for home 3 consumption and the personal use of the consumer.
4 (5) The Office of the Comptroller may restrict a family beer and wine 5 facility permit to the production of either family produced beer or family produced wine.
6 (6) (I) The holder of a permit may not simultaneously hold any other 7 license issued pursuant to this article.
8 (II) THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT APPLY IN FREDERICK COUNTY.
9 (7) The Office of the Comptroller may promulgate regulations regarding 10 limits on the quantities produced, requirements for record keeping, and any other 11 activities that relate to the operation of a family beer and wine facility.

19 (a) There is a Class 7 micro-brewery (on- and off-sale) license.
20 (b) The license shall be issued:
21 (1) By the State Comptroller;
22 (2) Only in the following jurisdictions:
23 (i) Allegany County;
24 (ii) Baltimore City;
25 (iii) Baltimore County;
26 (iv) The City of Annapolis;
27 (v) Anne Arundel County;
28 (vi) The thirteenth election district of Carroll County;
29 (vii) Charles County;
30 (viii) Dorchester County;
31 (ix) Frederick County;
32 (x) Garrett County;
33 (xi) Howard County;

SENATE BILL 578 3 1 (xii) Montgomery County; and 2 (xiii) Prince George's County; and 3 (3) (i) Only to a holder of a Class B beer, wine and liquor (on-sale) 4 license that is issued for use on the premises of a restaurant located in a jurisdiction listed 5 in paragraph (2) of this subsection; [or] 6 (ii) To a holder of a Class D alcoholic beverages license that is issued 7 for use on the premises of the existing Class D license if the premises are located in the 8 22nd Alcoholic Beverages District of Prince George's County; OR 9 (III) IN FREDERICK COUNTY ONLY, ALSO TO A HOLDER OF A 10 FAMILY BEER AND WINE FACILITY PERMIT (§ 2-101(S)) OR A CLASS 4 LIMITED 11 WINERY LICENSE (§ 2-205). (c) (1) A holder of a Class 7 micro-brewery license: 12 13 (i) May brew and bottle malt beverages at a single location; and 14 (ii) May not brew more than 10,000 barrels of malt beverage each 15 calendar year. (2) In Allegany County only, the holder of a Class 7 license: 16 17 (i) May brew in one location and may contract for the bottling of the malt beverage in another location; and (ii) Need not meet the hotel/motel requirements for a Class B beer, 19 wine and liquor licensee but shall meet the requirements for those Class B restaurants. 20 (d) (1) The on-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell at retail beer brewed 21 22 under this license to customers for consumption on the licensed premises. 23 (2) The off-sale privilege authorizes the holder to sell and deliver beer 24 brewed under this license to: 25 (i) Any wholesaler licensed under this article to sell beer in this State; 26 or 27 (ii) Any person who is located in a state other than Maryland who is 28 authorized under the laws of that state to receive brewed beverages. (3) (i) This paragraph applies only in the City of Annapolis, Anne 30 Arundel County, Baltimore City, Baltimore County, Charles County, Dorchester County, 31 Frederick County, Howard County, and Prince George's County. 32 (ii) The holder may sell at retail beer brewed under this license to customers for consumption off the licensed premises in refillable containers that are 33 sealed by the micro-brewery licensee at the time of each refill.
