- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 19 **Article Transportation**
- 20 20-102.
- 21 (a) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury
- 22 to or death of any person immediately shall stop the vehicle as close as possible to the
- 23 scene of the accident, without obstructing traffic more than necessary.
- 24 (b) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury
- 25 to or death of any person immediately shall return to and remain at the scene of the
- 26 accident until he has complied with § 20-104 of this title.
- 27 27-101.
- (o) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 20-102 of this article ("Driver
- 29 to remain at scene -- Accidents resulting in bodily injury or death") is subject to:

- 1 (1) For a first offense, a fine of not more than \$1,000 or imprisonment for 2 not more than [1 year] 5 YEARS or both;
- 3 (2) For a second offense, a fine of not more than \$2,000 or imprisonment for 4 not more than [2] 6 years or both; and
- 5 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, a fine of not more than \$3,000 or 6 imprisonment for not more than [3] 7 years or both.
- 7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 8 October 1, 1997.
