- 3 (a) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury
- 4 to or death of any person immediately shall stop the vehicle as close as possible to the
- 5 scene of the accident, without obstructing traffic more than necessary.
- 6 (b) The driver of each vehicle involved in an accident that results in bodily injury
- 7 to or death of any person immediately shall return to and remain at the scene of the
- 8 accident until he has complied with § 20-104 of this title.

- 10 (o) Any person who is convicted of a violation of § 20-102 of this article ("Driver 11 to remain at scene -- Accidents resulting in bodily injury or death") is subject to:
- 12 (1) For a first offense, a fine of not more than \$1,000 \$2,000 or imprisonment
- 13 for not more than {1 year} 5 YEARS or both;
- 14 (2) For a second offense, a fine of not more than \$2,000 or
- 15 imprisonment for not more than [2] 6 3 years or both; and
- 16 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, a fine of not more than \$3,000 \$5,000
- 17 or imprisonment for not more than [3] 7 4 years or both.
