2 State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and

3 Speech-Language Pathologists - Regulatory Authority

4 FOR the purpose of altering certain requirements for an individual to qualify for a license

5 to practice audiology; authorizing holders of certain limited licenses to practice in

6 certain settings under the supervision of specified individuals; authorizing the

7 issuance of certain limited licenses to an individual who has previously been issued

8 a limited license; authorizing licensed speech-language pathologists to delegate

9 certain duties to an assistant under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to

10 adopt certain regulations; prohibiting hearing aid dispensers from violating certain

11 consumer protection laws; and generally relating to the regulatory authority of the

- 12 State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and
- 13 Speech-Language Pathologists.

- 24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 4	(a) To qualify for a license to practice audiology, an applicant shall be an individual who meets the requirements of this section.
5	(b) The applicant shall be of good moral character.
6	(c) The applicant shall:
	(1) (I) Hold a master's degree or its equivalent in audiology from an educational institution which incorporates the academic course work and the minimum hours of supervised training required by the regulations adopted by the Board; and
	[(2)] (II) Have completed the period of supervised postgraduate professional practice in audiology as specified by the regulations adopted by the Board; OR
15	(2) HOLD A DOCTORAL DEGREE IN AUDIOLOGY FROM AN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTION WHICH INCORPORATES THE ACADEMIC COURSE WORK AND THE MINIMUM HOURS OF SUPERVISED TRAINING REQUIRED BY THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OR ITS EQUIVALENT.
17 18	(d) Except as otherwise provided in this title, the applicant shall pass an examination given or approved by the Board under this subtitle.

	(2) Demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Board that for the term of the limited license the applicant will practice audiology only under the supervision of an individual described under subsection (b)(2) of this section;

30 31	(b) (1) The purpose of a limited license is to permit an individual to practice audiology while completing the licensing requirements of this title.

6	(c) A limited license expires on the first anniversary of its effective date.

15	 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board shall issue a limited license to provide hearing aid services to an individual who is waiting to take a licensing examination under this subtitle. 	
	17 (b) The Board may issue a limited license to provide hearing aid services only to 18 an individual who:	
19	(1) [Has not been issued a limited license before;]	
20 21	[(2)] Except for taking and passing an examination under this subtitle, otherwise qualifies for a license;	
22 23	[(3)] (2) Submits to the Board an application on the form that the Board g provides;	
24 25	[(4)] (3) Satisfies the Board that the individual will provide hearing aid services only within the scope allowed under subsection (c) of this section; and	
26	[(5)] (4) Pays to the Board the application fee set by the Board.	
	 (c) While a limited license to provide hearing aid services is in effect, it authorizes the holder to provide hearing aid services only while being trained under the supervision of a licensed hearing aid dispenser. 	
30 31	(d) A limited license to provide hearing aid services expires on the first anniversary of its effective date.	
	(e) [(1)] Subject to the provisions of this subsection, the Board may renew once for an additional 1-year term the limited license to provide hearing aid services of an individual who:	
35	(1) (i) [1.] Takes but fails to pass the examination; or	

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1 (II) [2.] Does not take the examination for a reason that the Board 2 finds adequate to excuse the failure to take the examination;
3 (2) [(ii)] Submits to the Board a renewal application on the form that the 4 Board provides; and
5 (3) [(iii)] Pays to the Board the renewal fee set by the Board.

9 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board shall issue a limited license 10 to practice speech-language pathology to an applicant who:
 (1) Except for the examination and supervised postgraduate professional practice in speech-language pathology, meets the license requirements under § 2-302.2 of this subtitle;
 (2) Demonstrates to the satisfaction of the Board that for the term of the limited license the applicant will practice only under the supervision of an individual described under subsection (b)(2) of this section;
17 (3) Submits an application to the Board on the form that the Board18 requires; and
19 (4) Pays to the Board the application fee set by the Board.
 (b) (1) The purpose of a limited license to practice speech-language pathology is to permit an individual to practice speech-language pathology while completing the licensing requirements of this title.
 (2) While it is effective, a limited license to practice speech-language pathology authorizes the licensee to practice speech-language pathology under the supervision of:
26 (i) A fully licensed speech-language pathologist; or
 (ii) [An] IF THE INDIVIDUAL IS EMPLOYED IN A SETTING IN WHICH LICENSURE IS NOT REQUIRED AS PROVIDED UNDER § 2-301(B)(1)(I) AND (III) OF THIS SUBTITLE, AN individual who holds [a certificate of clinical competence] NATIONAL CERTIFICATION in speech-language pathology from:
