A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and 3 Speech-Language Pathologists - Appointment of Audiologist Members

4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to appoint the audiologist members of the

- 5 State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and
- 6 Speech-Language Pathologists from a certain list submitted to the Governor and
- 7 the Secretary of the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene by the Maryland
- 8 Academy of Audiology and the Maryland Speech-Language and Hearing
- 9 Association; requiring that the list contain a certain minimum number of people;
- 10 requiring the Maryland Academy of Audiology and the Maryland Speech-Language
- 11 and Hearing Association to notify by mail all licensed audiologists of the vacancy on
- 12 the Board; requiring the Maryland Academy of Audiology and the Maryland
- 13 Speech-Language and Hearing Association to conduct a ballot of all licensed
- 14 audiologists to select the names that will be submitted to the Secretary and the
- 15 Governor; making stylistic changes; and generally relating to the appointment of
- 16 audiologist members of the State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid
- 17 Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists.

- 28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1	Article - Health Occupations
2	2-201.
3 4	There is a State Board of Examiners for Audiologists, Hearing Aid Dispensers, and Speech-Language Pathologists in the Department.
5	2-202.
6	(a) (1) The Board consists of 13 members.
7	(2) Of the 13 Board members:
8 9	(i) 3 shall be licensed audiologists who have at least 5 years' paid work experience in audiology;
10 11	(ii) 3 shall be licensed speech-language pathologists who have at least 5 years' paid work experience in speech-language pathology;
12	(iii) 2 shall be physicians who:
13	1. Are licensed to practice medicine in this State; and
14 15	2. Hold a certificate of qualification from the American Board of Otolaryngology;
16 17	(iv) 2 shall be consumer members, 1 of whom shall be hearing impaired; and
18 19	(v) 3 shall be licensed hearing aid dispensers who have at least 5 years' paid work experience in dispensing hearing aids.
22	(3) The Governor shall appoint the physician members, with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the Maryland Society of Otolaryngology with the approval of the Medical and Chirurgical Faculty of the State of Maryland. There shall be at least [three] 3 names on the list.
26 27	(4) The Governor shall appoint the [audiologist and] speech-language pathologist members, with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the Maryland Speech-Language and Hearing Association. The number of names on the list shall be at least [three] 3 times the number of vacancies.
31 32 33	(5) (I) SUBJECT TO SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS PARAGRAPH, THE GOVERNOR SHALL APPOINT THE AUDIOLOGIST MEMBERS, WITH THE ADVICE OF THE SECRETARY, FROM A LIST SUBMITTED TO THE SECRETARY AND THE GOVERNOR, JOINTLY BY THE MARYLAND ACADEMY OF AUDIOLOGY AND THE MARYLAND SPEECH-LANGUAGE AND HEARING ASSOCIATION. THE NUMBER OF NAMES ON THE LIST SHALL BE AT LEAST 3 TIMES THE NUMBER OF VACANCIES.
35	(II) FOR EACH AUDIOLOGIST VACANCY, THE MARYLAND

11. NOTIFY BY MAIL ALL LICENSED AUDIOLOGISTS IN THE2STATE OF THE VACANCY TO SOLICIT NOMINATIONS TO FILL THE VACANCY; AND

2. CONDUCT A BALLOTING PROCESS BY MAIL BY WHICH
 EVERY LICENSED AUDIOLOGIST IN THE STATE IS ELIGIBLE TO VOTE ON THE NAMES
 OF THE LICENSED AUDIOLOGISTS TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE SECRETARY AND THE
 GOVERNOR.

7 [(5)] (6) The Governor shall appoint the hearing aid dispenser members, 8 with the advice of the Secretary, from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor 9 by the Maryland members of the Hearing Aid Specialist Association of Maryland, District 10 of Columbia, and Delaware. The number of names on the list shall be at least 3 times the 11 number of vacancies.

12 [(6)] (7) (i) The Governor shall appoint the consumer members with the 13 advice of the Secretary and the advice and consent of the Senate.

(ii) 1. The Governor shall appoint the hearing impaired consumer
member from a list submitted to the Secretary and the Governor by the Governor's Office
for Individuals with Disabilities.

17 2. The Governor's Office for Individuals with Disabilities shall18 solicit nominees from each of the hearing impaired associations in the State.

(f) (6) To the extent practicable, the Governor shall fill any vacancy on theBoard within 60 days [of] AFTER the date of the vacancy.

21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 22 October 1, 1997.
