- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the State to provide funding to University of Maryland
- 5 University College in certain amounts in certain fiscal years.
- 6 BY adding to

- 12 WHEREAS, Higher education, and the institutions that provide it, are increasingly
- 13 prominent factors in the quality of life and economic development of states and nations;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, The international economy, labor market demands for a highly skilled
- 16 and professional work force, and rapid technological change increasingly require
- 17 education beyond high school for both individuals and economies; and
- 18 WHEREAS, It is essential if Maryland is to maintain and improve its competitive
- 19 position in the region and the world, that Maryland's work force continue to be upgraded;
- 20 and
- 21 WHEREAS, There are increasing numbers of nontraditional and part-time
- 22 students in Maryland who require accessible and moderate cost higher education in order
- 23 to meet the work force demands of a changing economy; and
- 24 WHEREAS, University College, one of the constituent institutions in the University
- 25 of Maryland System, serves a unique role by providing a variety of educational programs,
- 26 including scientific, technical, and management programs, to enhance students' career
- 27 development while providing Maryland employers a more skilled and productive work
- 28 force; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There are 14,000 students attending University College programs in
- 2 Maryland who pay the highest undergraduate tuition among the State's public institutions
- 3 and two to three times the tuition charged by Maryland community colleges; and
- WHEREAS, Because of the State's severe economic downturn in 1992, the State
- 5 eliminated its funding commitment to help offset the relatively high cost of tuition at
- 6 University College; and
- WHEREAS, The State's economy has improved significantly since State assistance
- 8 to University College was eliminated; now, therefore,
- 9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 13 BEGINNING IN FISCAL YEAR 1999, THE STATE SHALL PROVIDE FUNDING FOR
- 14 UNIVERSITY OF MARYLAND UNIVERSITY COLLEGE IN THE FOLLOWING AMOUNTS:

- 16 EQUAL TO 10 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL TIME
- 17 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 18 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;
- 19 (2) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2000, AN AMOUNT
- 20 EQUAL TO 12 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 21 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 22 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;
- 23 (3) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2001, AN AMOUNT
- 24 EQUAL TO 14 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 25 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 26 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;
- 27 (4) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2002, AN AMOUNT
- 28 EQUAL TO 16 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 29 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 30 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR;
- 31 (5) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2003, AN AMOUNT
- 32 EQUAL TO 18 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 33 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 34 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR; AND
- 35 (6) FOR THE FISCAL YEAR THAT BEGINS JULY 1, 2004, AN AMOUNT
- 36 EQUAL TO 20 PERCENT OF THE STATE'S GENERAL FUND PER FULL-TIME
- 37 EQUIVALENT STUDENT APPROPRIATION TO THE 4-YEAR PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF
- 38 HIGHER EDUCATION IN THIS STATE FOR THE PRECEDING FISCAL YEAR.
- 39 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 40 October 1, 1997.
