- 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 13 Article Business Regulation
- 14 8-601.
- 15 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person may not act or offer to act 16 as a contractor in the State unless the person has a contractor license.
- 17 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person may not act or offer to act
- 18 as a subcontractor in the State unless the person has a contractor license or subcontractor
- 19 license.
- 20 (c) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person may not sell or offer to sell
- 21 a home improvement in the State unless the person has a contractor license or
- 22 salesperson license.

- 1 (d) A person who [knowingly and willfully] violates this section is guilty of a
- 2 misdemeanor and, on FIRST conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding [\$5,000] \$1,000
- 3 or imprisonment not exceeding [2 years] 30 DAYS or both AND, ON A SECOND OR
- 4 SUBSEQUENT CONVICTION, IS SUBJECT TO A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$5,000 OR
- 5 IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 2 YEARS OR BOTH.
- 6 8-623.
- 7 (a) This section only applies if there is no greater criminal penalty provided under 8 this title or other applicable law.
- 9 (b) A person who [knowingly and willfully] violates this title is guilty of a
- 10 misdemeanor and, on conviction, is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or
- 11 imprisonment not exceeding 6 months or both.
- 12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 13 October 1, 1997.
