A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages**
3 **(Out-of-State Licensees)**

4 FOR the purpose of prohibiting in Baltimore County certain alcoholic beverages licenses
5 from being issued to applicants who hold certain out-of-state licenses, with an
6 exception; renumbering; and generally relating to out-of-state licensees who apply
7 for a license in Baltimore County.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

17 (b-3) [(2)] (1) [A] IN ANNE ARUNDEL COUNTY, A Class A or Class D beer,
18 beer and light wine, or beer, wine and liquor license may not be issued except by way of
19 renewal [in Anne Arundel County] to a person, corporation, or limited liability company
20 holding an alcoholic beverage license in any other state, or Washington, D.C.

21 [(1)] (2) [A] IN BALTIMORE CITY, A Class A or Class D beer, beer and
22 light wine, or beer, wine and liquor license may not be issued except by way of renewal
23 [in Baltimore City] to a person, corporation, or limited liability company holding an
24 alcoholic beverage license in any other state.

25 (3) IN BALTIMORE COUNTY, A CLASS A OR CLASS D BEER, BEER AND
26 LIGHT WINE, OR BEER, WINE AND LIQUOR LICENSE MAY NOT BE ISSUED, EXCEPT BY
27 WAY OF RENEWAL, TO A PERSON, CORPORATION, OR LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY

2 WASHINGTON, D.C.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 1997.
