SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 Judicial Compensation Commission Report

- 3 FOR the purpose of proposing an alteration to the compensation of the members of the
- 4 Judiciary in this State, pursuant to Section 1-708 of the Courts and Judicial
- 5 Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.
- 6 WHEREAS, Section 1-708(b)(2) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of
- 7 the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a 7-member Judicial Compensation
- 8 Commission appointed by the Governor with 2 members appointed on nomination of the
- 9 President of the Senate, 2 members appointed on nomination of the Speaker of the
- 10 House of Delegates, 1 member appointed on nomination of the Maryland Bar
- 11 Association, and 2 members appointed at large. The Judicial Compensation Commission
- 12 is constituted as follows: appointments made on the nomination of the President of the
- 13 Senate: John Paterakis and Elizabeth Buck; appointments made on the nomination of the
- 14 Speaker of the House of Delegates: Bruce A. Kaufman and Charles R. Jenkins, Sr.;
- 15 appointment made on the nomination of the Maryland Bar Association: J. Michael
- 16 Conroy, Jr.; appointments at large: Elizabeth S. Morrison and Alice G. Pinderhughes.
- 17 The Commission members elected Bruce A. Kaufman, Chairman; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Section 1-708(d) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the
- 19 Annotated Code of Maryland provides as follows: the General Assembly may amend this
- 20 Joint Resolution to decrease any of the Commission's salary recommendations, but no
- 21 reduction may diminish the salary of a judge during his continuance in office. The
- 22 General Assembly may not amend this Joint Resolution to increase these recommended
- 23 salaries. Should the General Assembly not adopt or amend this Joint Resolution within
- 24 50 days of its introduction, the salaries recommended herein shall apply during Fiscal
- 25 Year 1998. Should the General Assembly reject any or all of the salaries herein
- 26 recommended, the salaries of the judges so affected shall remain unchanged during Fiscal
- 27 Year 1998 unless modified under other provisions of the law; and
- WHEREAS, The Judicial Compensation Commission held several meetings
- 29 between December of 1996 and January of 1997. It met with numerous persons, including
- 30 legislators, executive officials, bar associations, and judges. The Commission considered
- 31 many aspects and facets of judicial compensation. The Commission by a vote of 5 or more
- 32 of its members has recommended judicial salaries for Fiscal Year 1998; now, therefore, be 33 it
- 34 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That after
- 35 considering recommendations of the Judicial Compensation Commission, beginning July
