SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

- 1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning
- 2 Balanced Budget Amendment Ratification
- 3 FOR the purpose of ratifying the Balanced Budget Amendment to the United States
- 4 Constitution.
- 5 WHEREAS, The United States Congress has failed to enact a balanced budget
- 6 since 1969 and has no statutory or constitutional requirement to do so; and
- WHEREAS, Congress continues to spend far beyond its means as reflected in a
- 8 national debt of over \$4.8 trillion or \$19,000 for every man, woman, and child in America;
- 9 and
- WHEREAS, 49 of 50 states have recognized the necessity in requiring a balanced
- 11 budget in order to preserve and maintain the economic viability of their respective
- 12 jurisdictions; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland has already expressed its desire
- 14 for a balanced budget amendment to the United States Constitution by the passage of
- 15 Joint Resolution 77 of 1975; and
- WHEREAS, After long years of effort by many individuals throughout the United
- 17 States and the hard work of members of Congress from both political parties, a Balanced
- 18 Budget Amendment to the United States Constitution (HJR 1/SJR 1) has been passed
- 19 and sent to the states for ratification; now, therefore, be it
- 20 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 21 General Assembly of Maryland hereby ratifies House Joint Resolution 1/Senate Joint
- 22 Resolution 1, the Balanced Budget Amendment, as a part of the Constitution of the
- 23 United States; and be it further
- 24 RESOLVED, That the Governor of Maryland is requested to forward authentic
- 25 copies of this Resolution, under the Great Seal of the State of Maryland, to the Secretary
- 26 of State of the United States, the Presiding Officer of the Senate of the United States, the
- 27 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Administrator of General Services of
- 28 the United States.
