1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 Task Force on Organ and Tissue Donation

- 3 FOR the purpose of requesting the Governor to create a Task Force on organ and tissue
- 4 donation; specifying the duties of the Task Force; providing for staff support for the
- 5 Task Force; specifying the composition of the Task Force; requiring a report by a
- 6 certain date; and generally relating to organ and tissue donation.
- WHEREAS, Individuals who need transplant surgery live daily with
- 8 life-threatening medical conditions that prevent them from leading full, healthy, and
- 9 active lives; and
- WHEREAS, These individuals currently require the courage, persistence, and
- 11 patience to wait for months or years for a potential appropriate donor; and
- WHEREAS, Organ or tissue donation can be a lifesaving gift that comforts and
- 13 inspires donors and their families by saving and enhancing the lives of others who need
- 14 transplant surgery; and
- WHEREAS, There is a chronic shortage of donor organs resulting in needless
- 16 deaths of those who could have benefited from transplant surgery; and
- 17 WHEREAS, It is desirable to implement sensitive and skillful practices to help
- 18 encourage and increase organ and tissue donations; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Public commitment to organ and tissue donation needs to be inspired
- 20 and stimulated by identifying and removing barriers and impediments in protocols and
- 21 practices that reduce organ and tissue donations; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Appropriate persons must collaborate and coordinate efforts to review
- 23 and evaluate the current system that supports organ and tissue donations; and

1 2	WHEREAS, Those persons must also make recommendations that will allow more lives to be saved through transplantation; now, therefore, be it
	RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Governor is requested to create a Task Force on Organ and Tissue Donation; and be it further
6	RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall:
7 8	(1) review and evaluate the current organ and tissue donation protocols, practices, and laws in the State; and
9 10	(2) report to the Governor, and subject to § 2-1312 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly on or before December 1, 1997; and be it further
11	RESOLVED, That the report shall:
12	(1) make recommendations for any changes in law or practice that are needed to:
13	(i) ensure that the wishes of organ or tissue donors are implemented;
14	(ii) identify ways to increase the number of potential donors; and
15 16	(iii) work more effectively with potential organ donors and their families; and
17 18	(2) include any proposed legislation prepared to be considered by the General Assembly during the 1998 Session; and be it further
19 20	RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall consist of not more than 20 individuals, including:
