FISCAL NOTE

House Bill 220 (Delegate Conway, *et al.*) Judiciary

Wicomico County - Regulated Activities

This bill requires that certain tax exempt nonprofit and fraternal organizations must have been located in Wicomico County for at least five years before the Wicomico County Sheriff may issue them gaming licenses. The bill alters certain reporting requirements of gaming licensees, alters the licensing fee structure, and creates a Gaming Advisory Committee to assist in licensing and reporting.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Potential minimal increase in revenues. No effect on expenditures.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful impact on small businesses. Increasing the residence requirements from three to five years could result in the exclusion of some organizations from gaming activities for two additional years.

Fiscal Analysis

Local Revenues: Under current law an applicant for a gaming license must pay \$1 for each day gaming will take place plus \$1 for each game to be played. This bill would require the applicant to pay \$1 for each day the permit is valid plus \$1 per game per day. The bill would also allow the county to issue yearly permits; however, the license fee would continue to be assessed per day. The increase in revenues would be minimal. Likewise, any revenue increase attributable to additional licenses issued to nonprofits and fraternal organizations would be minimal.

Local Expenditures: Any increase in workload resulting from additional licenses being

issued could be absorbed with existing budgeted resources. Members of the Gaming Advisory Committee serve without compensation.
