House Bill 400 (Delegate Bobo) Environmental Matters

Referred to Economic & Environmental Affairs

Acupuncture

This enrolled bill includes acupuncturists as health care providers under the Health General Article. Members on the Board of Acupuncture will be reimbursed at a rate determined by the board instead of under the standard State travel regulations. The bill also designates a member of the board to administer the Acupuncture Board Fund. In addition, demonstrated experience in acupuncture or an apprenticeship in acupuncture will no longer satisfy a requirement for licensure by the board. The bill requires applicants to have the ability to communicate in English and eliminates the minimum passing score requirement of the licensure examination.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill codifies existing practice and makes technical changes to the application process.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful impact. Since demonstrated experience or apprenticeship in acupuncture no longer satisfies a requirement for licensure, applicants may incur additional costs meeting the education or training requirement in order to establish a business in acupuncture. It is anticipated that most acupuncturists are small businesses.
