**Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission - Authority to Issue Long-Term Debt
MC/PG 4-97**

This bill limits the authority of the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) to issue debt to an amount authorized by the General Assembly. The aggregate amount of outstanding debt, including bond anticipation notes and revenue bonds, may not exceed 7% of the total assessable base within the sanitary district. Currently, the limit is 14%. The General Assembly, however, may exempt certain bonds from the debt limit. In addition, the bill makes the water supply bonds subject to the debt limit. Under current law, these bonds are excluded from the debt limit.

This bill is effective July 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: As of June 30, 1996, the WSSC had \$1.87 billion in outstanding debt. Based on an assessable base within the sanitary district of \$43.5 billion, the WSSC's debt to assessable base ratio is 4.3%. Accordingly, the lower debt limit would not affect the WSSC's present ability to issue debt. With its current assessable base and a 7% limitation, the WSSC would have a \$3 billion debt limit.

Small Business Effect: None. The bill would not directly affect small businesses.
