Fire Prevention Commission, Office of the State Fire Marshal, and Explosives Advisory Council - Transfer to the Department of State Police

This departmental bill transfers the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Fire Prevention Commission, and the Explosives Advisory Council, including all resources and employees, from the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services (DPSCS) to the Department of State Police.

The bill is effective July 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures would increase by \$29,700 in FY 1998 as discussed below. Out-year expenditures reflect annualization and inflation. Revenues would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: The Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Fiscal Services concurs with this assessment.

Fiscal Analysis

State Effect: General fund expenditures would increase by an estimated \$29,716 in fiscal 1998, which reflects a 90-day start-up delay. This estimate reflects the cost of the State Police hiring one Fiscal Specialist to perform the payroll accounting duties currently done by fiscal personnel in DPSCS's consolidated accounting operations, which are not being transferred under this bill. It includes salaries, fringe benefits, and minimal ongoing operating expenses.

Total FY 1998 State Expenditures \$29,716

Future year expenditures reflect (1) full salaries with 3.5% annual increases and 3% employee turnover; and (2) 2% annual increases in ongoing operating expenses.

Any additional administrative costs incidental to the transfer provided by this bill would not significantly affect State finances. DPSCS's fiscal 1998 budget allowance for the these operations is \$8.97 million. Under this bill, that allowance would be transferred to the budget of the Department of State Police.
