Juvenile Causes - Open Hearings

This enrolled bill provides that a court may exclude the public from a hearing in which a child is alleged to be in need of supervision or assistance or to have committed an act that would be a misdemeanor if committed by an adult. A court is prohibited from excluding the public from a hearing in which a child is alleged to have committed an act that would be a felony if committed by an adult, except upon a finding of good cause. A court is required to announce adjudications and dispositions in open court in cases in which a child is alleged to have committed an act that would be a felony if committed by an adult, except upon a finding of good cause.
