House Bill 181 (Chairman, Commerce and Government Matters Committee) (Departmental - Transportation) Commerce and Government Matters

Vehicle Laws - Records - Availability to Child Support Enforcement Administration

This departmental bill allows the Child Support Enforcement Agency (CSEA) to have access to a digital photographic image or signature of an individual recorded by the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) in order to help identify non-custodial parents.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None, as discussed below.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: The Department of Transportation has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Fiscal Services concurs with this assessment.

Fiscal Analysis

State Effect: The MVA could provide the information to CSEA within existing budgeted resources. CSEA advises that access would be requested in a limited number of cases because it anticipates accessing this information only if a non-custodial parent cannot be reliably identified by other means. Accordingly, the bill is not expected to materially increase child support collections nor result in savings to public assistance programs.
