House Bill 751 (Delegate Owings, *et al.*)

Environmental Matters

Referred to Economic & Environmental Affairs

Health Occupations - Dental Hygienists

This amended bill requires an applicant for a dental hygienist license to be a graduate from a State-approved school of dental hygiene that is accredited by the American Dental Association Commission on Dental Accreditation. The program must require at least two years of education in an institution of higher education. The State Board of Dental Examiners may issue a temporary license to practice dental hygiene if the applicant satisfies the requirements in existing law and has graduated from an accredited dental hygiene program. The bill also provides that the State or the board may maintain an action to enjoin unauthorized practice of dental hygiene.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill's requirements could be handled with existing budgeted resources.
