FISCAL NOTE

House Bill 891 (Montgomery County and Prince George's County Delegations) Commerce and Government Matters

Prince George's County - Zoning - Municipal Corporations MC/PG 3-97

This bill authorizes the Prince George's County District Council to delegate specific zoning powers to a municipal government. These powers cover standards for design, parking and loading, and sign design; variances for lot size, setback requirements, and similar requirements; and landscaping requirements. A municipal government is subject to the substantive and procedural requirements and standards established by the District Council. In addition, a municipality may not impose stricter standards and requirements than the District Council. A party to an action of a municipal government has the same right of appeal to the circuit court as with the District Council.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. It is expected that any powers delegated to a municipal government could be handled with the entity's existing planning resources. In addition, the delegation of duties by the District Council is not expected to significantly decrease its workload.

Small Business Effect: Granting certain zoning powers to municipalities could have a minimal effect on small businesses to the extent that decisions made by municipalities differ from those of the District Council.
