## Vehicle Laws - Task Force to Study Motor Vehicle Liens, Regulation of Towing Practices, and the Disposition of Unclaimed Vehicles

This amended bill establishes a 21-member task force to study motor vehicle liens, towing practices, and unclaimed vehicles. The task force's focus includes, but is not limited to: (1) the regulation of storage, towing, and disposal of vehicles; (2) the disposition of abandoned vehicles; (3) the rights and obligations of vehicle owners who have their vehicles towed from their property; (4) the rights of vehicle owners who have their vehicles towed without their consent; and (5) the imposition of liens on motor vehicles. The Motor Vehicle Administrator must assign staff and provide administrative support.

The task force's report is due to the Governor, the Senate Judicial Proceedings Committee, and the House Commerce and Government Matters Committee no later than December 1, 1997. The bill takes effect June 1, 1997 and sunsets December 31, 1997.
