## **Controlled Dangerous Substances - Minors - Penalties**

This bill increases, from \$20,000 to \$50,000, the maximum penalty for felony convictions of using a minor in the illegal manufacture, distribution, or delivery of controlled dangerous substances.

## **Fiscal Summary**

State Effect: None. Jurisdiction for felony cases resides in the circuit courts.

**Local Effect:** Indeterminate local revenue increase due to the bill's increased monetary penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

Small Business Effect: None. The bill does not directly affect small businesses.
