House Bill 1393 (Delegate Barve)
Ways and Means

Education - Grants for Non- and Limited-English Proficient Students

This bill increases State funding for students enrolled in non- and limited English (LEP) programs from \$500 to \$1,000 per student. In addition, the bill removes the restriction prohibiting a student from being included in the LEP count for more than two school years.

This bill takes effect July 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures could increase by \$9,210,500 in FY 1998; future year increases reflect enrollment growth. Revenues would not be affected.

Local Effect: State aid to local governments could increase by \$9,210,500 in FY 1998. Expenditures would not be directly affected.

Small Business Effect: None. Small businesses would not be directly affected.

Fiscal Analysis

State Expenditures: Under current law, State aid for the LEP program in fiscal 1998 would total \$5.9 million (\$500 grant X 11,787 LEP students). This bill increases the per student grant to \$1,000 and removes the restriction that prohibits a student from being included in the LEP count for more than two school years, thus raising the LEP count by 3,317 students.

These two provisions would increase State expenditures by \$9.2 million in fiscal 1998. Future year expenditures are based on growth in total school enrollment.

Local Revenues: State aid to local governments could increase by \$9.2 million in fiscal 1998. The county-by-county impact is illustrated in **Exhibit 1**.
