Ozone Transport Assessment Group - Requiring Membership of State Elected Officials

This amended joint resolution requests that the Ozone Transport Assessment Group (OTAG), established by the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), be required to include one voting member from the legislature of each of the states represented by members of OTAG.

Fiscal Analysis

Background: The Ozone Transport Assessment Group (OTAG), established by the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), is comprised of State and federal air quality officials. OTAG is scheduled to make recommendations in 1997 to EPA on ozone control strategies for national and regional controls.
