House Bill 1104 (Delegate Montague) Judiciary

Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment - Spiritual Healing

This bill provides that the child abuse and neglect law may not be construed as requiring a parent to provide a child with medical treatment that is against the religious belief of the parent. This does not prohibit Child Protective Services from pursuing any legal remedy to provide necessary medical treatment for a child or complying with a federal requirement for provision of medical treatment for a disabled infant with a life-threatening condition. An investigation of the need for medical treatment by Child Protective Services must be conducted in a manner that is the least restrictive on the religious practice of the parent.
