House Bill 1204 (Delegate Barve) Economic Matters

Health Insurance Carriers - Assignment, Transfer, or Subcontract of Providers' Contracts

This bill prohibits a health insurer, nonprofit health service plan, or HMO (carrier) from assigning, transferring, or subcontracting a health care provider's contract without first informing the provider and obtaining the provider's written consent, except in cases of consolidation, acquisition, or merger. A carrier may not impair the contract of a provider on the basis that the provider refused to agree to an assignment, transfer, or subcontract.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not directly affect governmental operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: Potential minimal effect on small businesses as discussed below.

Fiscal Analysis

Small Business Effect: For the small business health care provider, this bill may have a positive impact if it stabilizes contract agreements and provides certainty concerning payment arrangements.
