Budget and Taxation

Property Tax - Advertisement

This departmental bill repeals the requirement that the Department of Assessments and Taxation annually advertise certain State property tax and assessment base information as well as information regarding tax credit programs and a summary of property owners' rights. This material is published at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in each county.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures would decrease by \$4,100 in FY 1998. Out-year estimates reflect annual inflation. Revenues would not be affected.

Fiscal Analysis

State Expenditures: Repeal of the requirement that the Department of Assessments and Taxation annually advertise certain property tax and assessment information would reduce general fund expenditures by approximately \$4,100 in fiscal 1998. Future year expenditures would increase by 2% annually to account for inflation.
