House Bill 525 (Delegate Bissett) Judiciary

Vehicle Laws - Recording of PBJs - Select Offenses

This bill requires the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) to keep records of each probation before judgment (PBJ) disposition of the following violations: (1) driving while a license is canceled, suspended, refused, or revoked; (2) failing to stop or remain at the scene of an accident in which the driver is involved; and (3) fleeing or eluding a police officer. The MVA currently maintains records of PBJs of any violation of driving while intoxicated, or under the influence of alcohol, drugs, and/or a controlled dangerous substance.

Fiscal Summary
