Senate Bill 5 (Senator Stone) Judicial Proceedings

#### **Tattooing - Minors - Prohibitions**

This bill prohibits the tattooing of a minor unless a parent or guardian of the minor is present during and consents to the tattoo. Violators are guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a maximum fine of \$5,000.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** Potential minimal increase in general fund revenues due to the bill's penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

**Local Effect:** Potential minimal increase in revenues due to the bill's penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal effect on small businesses. Business for approximately 30-40 store-front tattoo establishments and an indeterminate number of individuals who practice tattooing in their homes or at county fairs may decrease slightly.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Revenues:** General fund revenues could increase under the bill's monetary penalty provision for those cases heard in the District Court, depending upon the number of convictions and fines imposed.

**Local Revenues:** Revenues could increase under the bill's monetary penalty provision for those cases heard in the circuit courts, depending upon the number of convictions and fines imposed.
