Disclosure of Medical Records - Compulsory Process - Notice to Person in Interest

This enrolled bill requires a health care provider to disclose a medical record, under certain circumstances, without the authorization of a person in interest (1) in accordance with "compulsory process"; (2) to grand juries, prosecution agencies, or law enforcement agencies; or (3) to the Insurance Administration for enforcement purposes. The bill references current law under which (1) more stringent requirements apply to the disclosure of mental health records; and (2) health professional boards may obtain a record without notice to the patient to investigate a complaint.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not substantively change State activities or operations.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Although small business health care providers would be affected by the bill, there would be no discernible economic impact.
