Harness Racing - Restriction on Racing Time

This amended bill provides that a harness licensee may not hold live racing after 2 a.m. unless circumstances beyond the licensee's control cause a delay.

This bill is effective June 1, 1997.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal increase in general fund revenue. Expenditures would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None. This bill would not materially affect small businesses.

Fiscal Analysis

State Revenues: Regulations currently prohibit live harness racing starts after midnight, but not the reception of simulcast races. Thus, if a licensee should decide to hold live racing after midnight, general fund revenue could increase through the wagering tax. Wagering tax revenue is credited to a special fund, the surplus of which is credited to the general fund at the end of each fiscal year. The special fund is expected to have a surplus of \$2.0 million in fiscal 1998, so any increase in wagering tax revenue would effectively increase general fund revenue. Any such effect, however, is expected to be minimal.
