House Bill 227 (Delegate Bozman)

**Racing - Simulcasting**

---

This bill requires that receiving tracks holding betting on a race at an out-of-state track shall also receive any simulcast races that any in-state sending track asks to transmit during the time when the receiving track is holding betting on out-of-state races. The bill also repeals the requirement that the State Racing Commission must approve any contract for an in-state track to hold betting on a race at an out-of-state track, and provides that there is no limit to the number or types of races received from out-of-state tracks.

This bill is effective July 1, 1997.

**Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** General fund revenues could increase through the wagering tax if betting increases because tracks receiving out-of-state races are required to receive races sent from tracks in the State as well. Any such increase is expected to be minimal. Expenditures would not be affected.

**Local Effect:** None.

**Small Business Effect:** None. This bill does not directly affect small businesses.
